The power and wisdom of the crucified Christ. This Sunday, we dedicate ourselves anew to keeping God's commandments, as we celebrate the mystery of God's love for us, shown through the wisdom and power of Christ. Having rescued his people from slavery, God gives them the Ten Commandments. These offer guidance for liberation and right-living, rather than oppression and burden. The Gospel reading, however, indicates that many have not remained faithful to God's commandments. In their greed they have turned God's house into a marketplace. As Jesus ejects the buyers and sellers, we are reminded that salvation will come about through the death and resurrection of Christ, the true temple of the Divine. This week, we pray to hear the Word of God afresh in our own being. As we try to offer the Word hospitality and space to take root within us, we ask, as does the writer of the responsorial psalm, that it might revive the soul. We also pray for the freedom of our brothers and sisters throughout the world who are victims of modern-day slavery.

Heavenly God, we come here today to touch the reality of your presence in our world, to renew ourselves in our understanding of your presence in our lives. Routine and habit can sometimes rob us of our zeal and enthusiasm. As we listen to your Word here today, renew within us the sense of urgency and enthusiasm for your Word. Each of us is a Temple, wherein your glory dwells, help us to clear ourselves of clutter and false joys that we might know true hope and faith. Amen.
