Climate Conference COP26

COP26 is the 2021 United Nations climate change conference. For nearly three decades the UN has been bringing together almost every country on

earth for global climate summits – called COPs – which stands for 'Conference of the Parties'. In that time climate change has gone from being a fringe issue to a global priority. Most experts believe COP26 has a unique urgency. Pope Francis, along with other religious leaders has called on those attending COP26 to renew their commitment to keep global temperatures below 1.5°C and to take action to make this possible. "We have inherited a garden: we must not leave a desert to our children," the statement says. We are asked to pray for the success of COP26 during these days.
