#### Happy are those who trust in the Lord.

The theme of our mass readings this weekend can be summarised in two words: Happiness and Trust. Looking for happiness has always been at the core of people's preoccupations. In the 1<sup>st</sup> reading, Jeremiah

tells his audience that they need to make a clear choice: they either trust only in people, or only in God. With striking images from nature, Jeremiah contrasts dry, wild wastelands with a luxurious tree growing by the waterside. The responsorial psalm uses similar imagery to make the same point: trusting in the Lord will bring happiness. St. Luke's 'Beatitudes' (Gospel) include warnings for those who have made the wrong choices: 'Alas for you ...' So our prayer this week may well centre around the choices we have made, do make, and will make, as we try to find happiness - not just for ourselves, but also for those around us or for the world at large. We can perhaps also ask the Lord for greater trust in him.

## A Listening Lent across - Kildare and Leighlin

Pope Francis wants to hear from the whole Church about  $\int_{\mathcal{A}} Synod$  the reality of being part of the People of God right now. **2021** He wants us to have a conversation about how we are journeying together and with God in our local parishes. He wants us to dream dreams together about our future.

And he wants everyone's voice to count. During Lent 2022 there will be many opportunities for people to take part in our listening phase of the synod. But who was Saint Valentine? Flowers, chocolates, red hearts and romance seem to sum up Saint Valentine's Day and yet all of these were very distant from the life of the Roman priest who gives this feast day its name. Valentine was a priest who lived in the time of the great persecutor Claudius II. Claudius issued an edict

prohibiting the marriage of young people, on the basis that unmarried soldiers fought better than married ones, who might fear for their wives or families if they died in battle. Saint Valentine seemed to operate in a very permissive society and people of faith did their very best to encourage the Church's vision for marriage and relationships. In presenting that vision Valentine secretly married young couples. He was eventually caught, imprisoned, and tortured. The story is told that he cured the daughter of one of the judges assigned to his case. The young girl was blind. The judge became a believer as a result. Valentine was sentenced to execution, all because of his promotion of Christian marriage in the year 269AD. And the last message Saint Valentine wrote before facing his executioner was a note to this young girl signed off "from your Valentine". And so, today's commercial business has been born out of that note and out of this man, we know as Saint Valentine.
