IT IS THE LORD WHO KEEPS FAITH FOREVER

We pray today that we will have the grace and strength to remain centred on Christ. May our prayer life lead us to respond with compassionate action to the needs of our less fortunate sisters and brothers across the world.

St. Therese of Lisieux Feastday Sat Oct 1st

St. Therese of Lisieux was born on January 2, 1873. From



obscurity as a young, idealistic Carmelite nun she has emerged as one of our best-loved saints. Her simplicity attracts us because she puts holiness within our reach. She died at 24 yrs of age on Sept 30th, 1897. St. Therese loved nature, and often used the

imagery of nature to explain how the Divine Presence is everywhere, and how everything is connected in God's loving care and arms. Therese saw herself as "the Little Flower of Jesus" because she was just like the simple wildflowers in forests and fields, unnoticed by the greater population, yet growing and giving glory to God. This is how she understood herself before the Lord – simple and hidden, but blooming where God had planted her.

St. Vincent de Paul, feastday next Tuesday Sept 27th. St. Vincent de Paul a French priest is the patron saint of the 'Society of St. Vincent de Paul' (SVP) which was founded in 1833 by Frederic Ozanam. From the outset the Society favoured a practical, direct approach to dealing with poverty. Its goal is to fight poverty in all its forms through its practical assistance to people in need. It offers direct, personal assistance that is non-judgemental and based on the need of the individual or family. As cost-of-living rates continue to increase so do the many demands made on the group.
