

"COME AND SEE" In today's First Reading we hear the Lord's dramatic call of Samuel, and how Samuel fails to hear and discern it properly at first. The young Samuel might well have grown up praying with words like those in today's Psalm – "You do not ask for sacrifice and offerings, but an open ear. You do not ask for holocaust and victim. Instead, here am I". We can easily imagine him, in the Temple, offering a prayer of commitment to follow the Lord's will. The Gospel continues the story of Jesus's Baptism. John the Baptist, having recognised Jesus as the Lamb of God, points two of his own followers to Jesus. These scripture texts

depict for us stories of call and response. During the coming week, let's ponder God's call in our own lives, and reflect both on the level of our attentiveness and on the depth of our response.



WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY Jan 18th/25th

The chosen theme for this year's Church Unity Week is 'You shall love the Lord your God... and your neighbour as yourself' (Lk 10:27). The parable of the Good Samaritan is one of the best-known passages of Scripture, yet one that never seems to lose its power to challenge indifference to suffering and to inspire solidarity. It is a story about crossing boundaries that calls our attention to the bonds that unite the whole human family. In choosing this passage of Scripture for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, the churches of Burkina Faso have invited us to join with them in a process of self-reflection as they consider what it means to love our neighbour in the midst of a security crisis. Communities in our context may be less vulnerable to acts of mass violence than in

Burkina Faso, but there are still many living with the memory and/or the threat of serious violence, centred on issues of identity and belonging. There are also groups within communities, including people from ethnic minority backgrounds and people seeking asylum, who feel particularly vulnerable to violence or being displaced by the threat of violence. We pray: God of love, who writes love in our hearts, instil in us the courage to look beyond ourselves and see the neighbour in those different from ourselves and to be the unexpected neighbour, that we may truly follow Jesus Christ our brother and our friend, who is Lord, for ever and ever. Amen.

Brigid 1500 - On Thursday, 1st February, there will be a special Ecumenical Service at 11.00 a.m. in St. Brigid's Cathedral, Kildare, entitled, "Celebrating St. Brigid. Brigid 1500: A Service of Thanksgiving." This Service will be dedicated to commemorating the Feast Day of St. Brigid and the 1500th anniversary of her death. The co-leaders of the service are Bishop Denis Nulty, and the Most Rev Patricia Storey, Church of Ireland Bishop of Meath and Kildare. The Reverend Canon Dr. Alison Joyce, Rector of St. Bride's Church, Fleet Street in the heart of London, will deliver the sermon.

Cathedral Evening Prayer for St Brigid.

February 1st marks the opening of a national year commemorating St Brigid, patron of our diocese and secondary patron of Ireland, 1500 years since her death. Bishop Denis invites people from across the diocese to join him for a special evening prayer in the Cathedral of the Assumption on February 1st at 7:30 pm. Music will be led by Fr. Liam Lawton and the diocesan choir.
